The board has also been working on outreach! We took out ads in Early Music Seattle / Seattle Baroque's programs as well as those of Gallery Concerts, to help spread the word about Pacific Northwest Viols and our Play Days. We have also

## Musica Poetica: Rhetorical Articulation for Polyphonic Domination!

## by Malachai Bandy

Using works by Arcadelt, Lassus, Morales, and others as our rhetorical playground, I will help you forge connections between textual meaning, counterpoint principles, and physical viol technique guaranteed to improve your individual and ensemble skills in any sixteenth-century polyphonic context. By learning to identify "persuasive" musical features in any repertoire, we will sharpen your so-called "weapons of rhetoric"— something sure to please your polyphonic friends and terrify your technical demons!

Multi-instrumentalist Malachai Komanoff Bandy is Assistant Professor of Music at Pomona College (founding member of the Claremont Colleges consortium), where he teaches music history courses handling topics ranging from pre-1750s musical symbolism, esotericism, and rhetoric to music and LGBTQIA+ identities. He holds a Ph.D. in historical musicology from the USC Thornton School of Music, supported by Provost and Oakley Endowed Fellowships. Previously, Bandy graduated cum laude, with Distinction in Research and Creative Work from Rice University's Shepherd School of Music with double bass and music history degrees. In 2019, he received both the Society for Seventeenth-Century Music's Irene Alm Memorial Prize and the AMS Pacific Southwest Chapter's Ingolf Dahl Award in Musicology for his investigations of Dieterich Buxtehude's mathematical compositional practices in his basso ostinato psalm settings.

As a historical string and double-reed player, Bandy has performed with American and European ensembles including The Orpheon Consort, Ars Lyrica Houston, Bach Collegium San Diego, Voices of Music, Musica Angelica, Tesserae Baroque, Ciaramella, and as a viola da gamba soloist with the Los Angeles Opera and Master Chorale. As a TV/Film recording artist, he is also featured on various historical string and wind instruments in the scores to Outlander, Foundation, The Witcher, 10 Cloverfield Lane, Welcome Home, the Emmy-winning title theme for DaVinci's Demons, and others.

Bandy's current scholarly projects concern Christian mysticism, esotericism, and numerology in North-German Baroque repertoires, as well as viola da gamba technique, instrument design, and iconography.



## Circuit Rider with Wendy Gillespie

We are excited to have been awarded a Circuit Rider grant from the Viola da Gamba Society of America, and to announce that Wendy Gillespie will be our Circuit Rider for 2023, with visits currently planned as follows:

- Thursday, April 13 through Sunday, April 16
- Thursday, June 1 through Sunday, June 4
- Thursday, September 7 through Sunday, June 10
- Thursday, November 16 through Sunday, November 19

Wendy will offer a mix of private lessons and group lessons, consort coaching, and will also host Play Along with Wendy sessions in which we can read through a variety of music as a group with her guidance.

Wendy says that "an inexplicable affinity to polyphony" drew her to the viola da gamba a very long time ago. I am sure that is something that most of us can associate with!. After 32 years as faculty at the Jacobs School of Music, Indiana University, Bloomington, Wendy has graduated to Professor Emerita status, and has resumed life on the road. She is a founding member of Fretwork and long-time member of Phantasm, with her name appearing on more than 100 commercial recordings, and is a past president of the VdGSA and recipient of EMA's Thomas

Binkley Award for outstanding achievement in performance and scholarship by the director of a university or college early music ensemble.

Nearly 25% of our membership responded to our 2023 Circuit Rider with Wendy Gillespie survey with your 15 responses showing the following:

- 92% said they're planning on participating in the Circuit Rider,
- 80% said they are planning on in-person participation,
- 86% said they are interested in Group Play Along sessions,
- 71% said they'd be interested in working on a piece or pieces with Wendy over multiple Circuit Rider visits
- 67% said they are interested in small group lessons on a theme,
- 47% said they are interested in small group lessons on an instrument,
- 41% said they'd be interested in having a virtual option for participation,
- 33% are interested in private lessons and private consort coaching

We understand that there are concerns with travel distance, COVID, the incremental benefits of working with a new/different instructor (if you already have one), having adequate time for preparation, etc. Please don't hesitate to reach out and share additional feedback and to voice any questions or concerns that you might have. I will work with the board to make sure we do a better job this year in getting information, music, and sign-ups out for our Circuit Rider sessions well in advance. As you can see from the length of Wendy's planned visits, she wants to develop a relationship with us and make herself available at the widest range of possible times. For those of us that are retired, the Thursday/Friday slots should work nicely, while those of us that work will more likely be drawn to weekend slots and sessions. This also gives us the opportunity to potentially work on something across multiple days.
